<u>Thornton Oakley's</u> <u>"Unloading An Ocean Steamer"</u>

The movement and noises of unloading the cargo are very well told and one can even imagine the strange odors of the place - but you haven't given enough individuality to the setting.

You might take some portion of the waterfront of New York or Boston where ships are unloading or even an arch of the Brooklyn Bridge to lend character to the scene.

A mass of buildings beyond in the bright sunlight would give an added value both as interest and to offset the shadow of foreground.

You all doubtless have read Kingsley's "Water-Babies" and know how the strange child is carried through wonderful adventures fraught with great danger—in search of the other side of no-where.

When he finally reaches the place "Mrs. Done-by-as-you-did" tells him she will take him home by the back stairs—but she must blind-fold him for if she doesn't, everyone will want to go by way of the back stairs as it is the shorter way—

And so she puts the handkerchief on with the right hand—and takes it away with the left—

Perhaps Kingsley himself didn't know what a great truth lay hidden in this story. It may be applied to painting.

As you know it takes five years to learn how to paint a picture and then you come to find out that you only have to imagine things vividly and make them real as they are.

Tell the truth and do not make the work merely clever—for the world is growing tired of that—I feel it in the air.

Plenty of work is being done in New York that is better technically than the work here.

Yet the work of this school is being more and more sought after and the art-editors say it is conscientious—which means that it is carefully thought out and true to nature—
